Modi Public School, Siliguri was established in 2014 by Nangalia Pokarmal Educational Society with a dream to encourage children to give their best in an attempt to realise their dreams. Since its inception, the school has stressed on both scholastic and co-scholastic activities as both the aspects are inseparable. The school justly provides an infrastructure where children can hone their skills in art & craft, dance, music, culinary, games *etc.*

The school has a library with a good collection of books and every year there is an addition in its number as per requirement. The laboratories – computer, physics, chemistry, biology and mathematics, are well-equipped and as per the standard prescribed by the Board. The music, dance, art & craft and culinary studios are also well-equipped.

The school's vision is to work in partnership with the students, parents and the community at large to a create positive and inclusive environment for high quality learning and teaching where everyone is valued and respected.

The mission of the school is to provide equal opportunity to the children to hone their skills. To retain smiles on their faces, to develop a mind that is curious and inquisitive and a sensitivity that makes them humane in thought, word and deed. The focus is on “learning beyond the classroom”.

The institution has a clear understanding of the present-day scenario and every care is taken to provide an environment to the students where they can learn without any fear and restrictions. The school is highly sensitive towards gender issues and takes utmost care so that no form of discrimination exists in the school campus.

The resources available with the school collected through fees takes care of the needs of the school - be it the salaries of the staff or upgrading the infrastructure of the school. The Trust, is benevolent towards the motto of spreading knowledge and as per the budget plan prepared by the SMC, funds projects wherever needed.

The school has classes from 1 to 12. The subjects covered at different grades are –

- a] 1 & 2 : Two languages – English & Hindi / Bengali / Nepali, Mathematics, EVS, ICT, Art Education, Games;
- b] 3 : Two languages – English & Hindi / Bengali / Nepali, Mathematics, EVS, ICT, G.K., Art Education, Games;
- c] 4 & 5 : Two languages – English & Hindi / Bengali / Nepali, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, ICT, G.K., Art Education, Games;
- d] 6, 7 & 8 : Two languages – English & Hindi / Bengali / Nepali, Third language – Hindi / Bengali, Mathematics, Social Science, Science, ICT, G.K., Art Education, Games;
- e] 9 & 10 : Two languages – English & Hindi A / Hindi B / Bengali / Nepali, Mathematics, Social Science, Science, Artificial Intelligence / Information Technology, Art Education, Games;
- f] 11 : English Core, English Elective, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer Science, Business Studies, Accountancy, Economics, Physical Education, History, Geography, Political Science, Artificial Intelligence, Games;
- g] 12 : English Core, English Elective, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer Science, Business Studies, Accountancy, Economics, Physical Education, History, Geography, Political Science, Artificial Intelligence, Games.

The distribution of classes for each scholastic subject is based on modules prescribed from time to time by the Board. Due weightage has been given to dance, music, art & craft, culinary and games. While distributing the classes every care is being taken to see to it that languages – first and second and mathematics are conducted every day.

The syllabus of the different subjects for the different classes have been fragmented in such a way that the students learn at their own pace and are in a position to comprehend the essence of the subjects at the end of the year. Syllabus of different classes for 2021-22 have been uploaded on Google Classroom as well as on school's website.

“Know Your Aptitude” test, introduced by the Board for the students of senior classes in order to guide the students and parents with respect to course of streams or selection of subjects at +2 level and beyond, was conducted in the month of March 2021 for the students of classes 10 and 12.

The school's Health & Wellness Teacher takes care of the mental health and behavioural issues of the children and guides them in consultation with their parents, wherever needed. The school has implemented the Awakened Citizen's Programme of Ramkrishna Mission in Classes 7 & 8. The response of the students is positive and the Resource Persons of the Mission are very supportive.

Teachers' Training

The school is implementing the different initiatives being taken up by the Centre of Excellence, CBSE, Bhubaneswar Region. The professional development programmes conducted for the principals and the teachers are being attended by the all the teachers on a regular basis. The unique IDs created by COE, Bhubaneswar Region, for the teachers of the school to attend different courses organised by it have helped the school immensely. The NISHTHA courses which were made available on DIKSHA portal in the month of October 2020 were utilised by the teachers teaching till classes 8. The teachers also completed the courses on experiential learning and competency-based education. The courses on blended learning and integration of technology on DIKSHA platform has been of great help to the teachers under the present circumstances. The Computer Department of the school is helping and guiding the teachers in integrating AI with the syllabus.

Academic achievement

In view of the increasing number of Covid-19 cases in the country, CBSE *vide* notifications dated 14.04.21 and 01.06.21 cancelled the Board Examinations for class 10 and 12 respectively. Instead, the CBSE formulated a detailed criteria for tabulation of marks for classes 10 and 12 by the schools. The results of both classes 10 and 12 are expected to be declared by the end of July.

Environmental Education

As during the entire academic year of 2020-21 the school remained close due to Covid-19, no direct action could be taken to implement different environmental projects in the school. The students of different classes participated on online activities and the teachers tried their best to remind the students to stay safe and protected during the trying times.

For the session 2021-22 many activities have been lined up to engage the students in activities associated with nature. As a part of World Environment Day celebration on 05.06.21, the students actively participated in reuse of materials, caring for animals, slogan writing *etc.*

Sports Achievement

As all the educational institutions are closed for Covid, no sports activities could be conducted during 2020-21. A similar situation prevails for 2021-22 as well, as different variants of Covid are affecting different parts of the country and the world. The children being considered the most vulnerable section, the chances of opening of primary and middle sections of the schools seems impossible. In case the school reopens after the Durga Puja vacation, then activities associated with FIT India movement will be initiated.

Innovations

With a switchover from traditional method of teaching to online mode of teaching during the session 2020-21, few of the teachers struggled to get adjusted with the new normal. The webinars conducted by different organisations and the support from the CBSE helped the

teachers to tide over the initial hitches. The teachers, in a slow and steady manner, accommodated different forms of online teaching practices in their lessons plans. Every step is being taken to make virtual classroom teaching a lively one with active participation from the students.

Parent Teacher Activities

Due to the closure of the school all interactions are on virtual platform. The school and the teachers are extending all forms of help to make the teaching-learning process an enjoyable one. Suggestions given by the parents are taken up seriously and accommodated wherever possible. The parents on their part are also helping the school to tide over the crisis arisen due to Covid.

Role of SMC

The crisis created by Covid during 2020-21 forced the SMC to take certain important decisions. The members of the SMC in its meeting in February 2021 agreed that the Covid crisis has created a situation for the educational institutions to think differently *vis a vis* teaching-learning methodologies. The committee recommended that the entire school should be made wi-fi enabled and blended learning with the integration of technology should be made part and parcel of delivery of education. The committee desired to invest in classroom interactions by upgrading the devices in the classrooms starting from installations of PCs to cameras, routers *etc.*
